Most gemstones begin as minerals that crystallize below the earth's surface under extreme heat and pressure. Gemstones are valued for their rarity, beauty, and durability.
There are two kinds of gemstones: precious and semiprecious.
Some gemstones are formed by layers of sediment. Others, known as organic, are made from plant and animal materiallike pearls inside mollusks.

Many scientists think diamonds and other gemstones are billions of years old. But the radiocarbon found in diamonds can't last that long, so they must've formed recently.

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## What's a jewel?

A jewel is a gemstone that's been cut and polished, which makes it shiny.


## Did you know?

Gemstones are evaluated on their hardness using the Mohs scale. This measures how difficult it is for them to be scratched. The softest gemstone is amber, while the hardest is diamond.
